**CANDIDATE NAME: LEWIS TERMAN** 

**BIOGRAPHY:** Lewis Terman received a BS degree in Physics in 1956 and an MS and PhD in Electrical Engineering in 1958 and 1961 from Stanford University. He retired from IBM's Research Division in 2006 after forty-five years, and currently holds the title of IBM Research Emeritus. His past work focused on solid-state circuits, semiconductor technology, memory design and technology, digital and analog circuits and processor design. He received nine major IBM technical awards, including three corporate awards. He was elected to the IBM Academy of Technology in 1991, and served

as President of the Academy in 2001-2003. He was elevated to <u>IEEE Fellow</u> in 1975 for contributions to the design and development of semiconductor computer memory and logic circuitry. He has been active as an IEEE volunteer and member for over fifty years. He served as <u>IEEE President</u> in 2008.

# DESCRIPTION OF ACCOMPLISHMENT(S) RELATIVE TO THE CREATION, DEVELOPMENT, OR ADVANCEMENT OF THE TECHNICAL OBJECTIVES OF THE IEEE:

Dr Terman started IEEE volunteer service as a member of the Solid State Circuits Council in 1972, spending many years in publications and then conference activities. Supporting first SCCC/SCCS and then ED-S, he was editor and special issue guest editor of four publications, and has been on the program committee and served as program chair and general chair of seven conferences. He is responsible for the creation of six new S/C conferences. As a CA-S member, he had a lead role in the creation of the Council on Electronic Design Automation. As an SSCC member he created the first IEEE Journal special issue annual series from a conference held outside of Regions 1-6. Terman led the activity to transition the Solid State Circuits Council to a Society in 1997. His clarity, diligence and strategic focus made him ideal for governance activities. Over the years he has been involved in governance of 3 Societies (ED-S President, SSCS President, CA-S Board of Governors member). Terman served as TAB Treasurer from 1995-1998. This was a financially unsettling time, as it was during this period that the depletion of the General Fund and its implications became clear. As TAB Treasurer and then volunteer, Terman was instrumental working with the IEEE BoD and TAB to structure a new financial model for the entity. He served as the TAB Vice-President in 2001. As TAB Treasurer he created the TAB support line, which has become the mechanism for funding TAB activities, separating TAB operations from S/C operations. This the first move towards financial transparency in the new financial model. Throughout his career, he has demonstrated a passion for recognizing peers with awards. He was the nominator for 10 successful IEEE Fellow elevations, 2 successful TFA recipients, and 2 successful Medal recipients, including the IEEE Medal of Honor.
