
TAB HALL OF HONOR RECIPIENT NOMINATION FORM



CANDIDATE NAME: PETER CLOUT

BIOGRAPHY: Peter Clout founded Vista Control Systems, a spin-off from Los Alamos National Laboratory, in 1989 and retired from the company in December 2017. Vista Control Systems sells a software product for collecting, displaying and storing real-time data. It used in government, research and industry. Before founding Vista, he developed control systems for two particle accelerators at Los Alamos. Going back further, he was for three years at the European Molecular Biology Laboratory in Hamburg, Germany and before that Daresbury Laboratory in England working on standards for CAMAC and developing data acquisition systems. Peter has degrees in Physics from University College, London (BSc) and the University of York (DPhil). He spent some time computer programming prior to

entering University College London at English Electric. Thus, his entire career has been involved with computers and the electronics associated with real-time systems for research initially and then industry and government applications.

DESCRIPTION OF ACCOMPLISHMENT(S) RELATIVE TO THE CREATION, DEVELOPMENT, OR ADVANCEMENT OF THE TECHNICAL OBJECTIVES OF THE IEEE:

On taking up the position of Chair of the Society Review Committee, Peter found that 18 of the reports from the previous four years had not been completed. These he quickly processed and by the end of April 2002 he was able to report to the Strategic Planning and Review Committee (SPARC) that this had been done and offered them to go forward to TAB. In addition, Peter reviewed and updated the TAB Operations Manual entry, the review questionnaire and the review schedule. For the first time, his reports to SPARC featured suggested best practices identified in the reviews. His leadership as Chair of the TAB Society Review Committee encouraged good communications and improved planning of the review process. He initiating a committee meeting the evening before to discuss the next days reviews. He changed the focus of the committee's activities from a confrontational review of Society activities to a constructive review focused on helping Societies improve their operations. Thus, the review process turned into one of a helpful conversation.

In 2002-2003 the Society Review Committee reported to SPARC and did not report directly to TAB but through SPARC. However, Peter presented the review procedure as part of the leadership training each year at TAB.

In 2002 TAB as a whole passed a motion of appreciation for his leadership in bringing the SRC up-to-date in reviews and operations.

It could also be noted that as a member of the Ad Hoc committee formed after Roger Pollard's untimely death, Peter was involved in the formation of the Hall of Honor and was for 3 years the first chairman of the committee and then served on the committee for a further 2 years. His drive and energy in promoting and leading the then new Hall of Honor ensured its successful establishment.
